- Maintain our Forestry Stewardship Council (FSC) accreditation with a third party audit system;
- Integrate an external sustainability system (SustainIQ) in putting key data in order to produce reports for KPI environmental benchmarking;
- Provide guidance and support to staff members to allow them to select sustainable products and services;
- Ensure where appropriate suppliers understand the key sustainable issues so that they can tailor their products accordingly;
- Investigate opportunities for the recycling and reuse of materials where appropriate; and,
- Ensure non-discrimination against local and smaller suppliers.

The Company will work to develop clear objectives to minimise the environmental and social effects associated with the products and services purchased and measure and communicate our progress.

The Managing Director has overall responsibility for the implementation of this policy and will ensure that its effectiveness is communicated to all levels within the Company. It is available on request and reviewed annually at Management Review Meetings to ensure its suitability for the company.
